



MD 210 (Indian Head Highway) Advanced Utility Relocation Work Interchange Construction at Livingston Road/Kerby Hill Road

WINTER/SPRING 2016 CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

The Maryland Department of Transportation's (MDOT) State Highway Administration (SHA) continues pre-construction activity along MD 210 (Indian Head Highway) at Livingston Road/Kerby Hill Road for its forthcoming interchange construction project. Weather and progress permitting, all phases of work should be complete by the end of 2018.

Construction activities completed to date include the advanced clearing and tree removal along northbound MD 210 between Palmer Road and I-95/I-495 (Capital Beltway). This work was necessary for advanced utility relocation work and future road widening activities.

With the advanced clearing and tree removal work along northbound MD 210 now complete, utility companies continue the process of relocating their water, sewer, electric, gas, and telecommunications lines. Work during this phase will mostly take place during daytime hours but crews are permitted to work Sunday through Saturday, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. This work is expected to continue through late 2016.

TEMPORARY LANE SHIFTS AND CLOSURES

Travel lanes on MD 210 travel may be shifted toward the median to allow additional work areas for all utility relocation work. All lanes will remain open to traffic during peak hours. Crews are also permitted to temporarily close a single left or right traffic lane on northbound or southbound MD 210:

- **Sunday-Saturday, 9 a.m. – 3 p.m.**
