### SHA RESUMES US1/MD 201 PROJECT PLANNING STUDY


The State Highway Administration (SHA) has resumed Project Planning Studies for the US 1 / MD 201 Corridor Study from MD 198 to I-95/I-495 (The Capital Beltway).

In the Spring of 2002 an Informational Public Meeting was held to present a range of Alternatives to address the increasing congestion occurring in the corridor and to support planned economic development. Following that Informational Meeting, the Alternatives were reviewed by the Environmental Agencies and suggestions were offered to reduce and minimize the natural and socio-economic impacts. Prior to completing a Draft Environment Document, the project was deferred pending resolution of funding issues and other project priorities.

As a result of additional funding being added to the Consolidated Transportation Program, and due to continued increasing congestion, Project Planning Studies are being resumed. The Study will pick up with a review of the Alternatives previously developed, including new traffic studies, current development plans, and updating the environmental inventory and impacts. Previous and current concerns of the Environmental Agencies will be included in this review.

We anticipate presenting the results of this review and the refined Alternatives at an Informational Meeting/Workshop in Spring/Summer 2007. Following that Informational Meeting, we will begin preparation of the Draft Environmental Document.

As always, citizen involvement in the planning process is encouraged. 
