The Maryland State Highway Administration (SHA) is nearing the conclusion of the Tier I Study for the US 220 Project Planning Study from I-68 (National Freeway) in Maryland to Corridor H in West Virginia. After the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) issues a Record of Decision for this project, the SHA will begin a Tier II detailed Project Planning Study to investigate transportation improvements to US 220 south of I-68 in Maryland.

# US 220 Corridor Planning Study

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The US 220 Tier I Project's National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) analysis and Draft Environmental Impact Statement focused on wide corridor-level planning efforts. Improvements within these corridors will provide an upgraded north-south transportation system; support efforts to increase mobility and regional commerce for residents, businesses, and visitors; and support economic development throughout the Appalachian regions of Maryland, West Virginia, Pennsylvania, and Virginia. SHA is working with West Virginia, FHWA, and federal and state agencies to reach an agreement on a Preferred Corridor in order to complete the Tier I Study. The SHA's Tier II Project Planning Study builds on the Tier I project and would focus on a detailed evaluation of alternatives in the Preferred Corridor selected at the conclusion of the Tier I Study and focus only on Maryland's portion of the corridor. SHA will continue to provide updates as the project moves into the Tier II phase.
