



US 1 (Baltimore Avenue) Brick Paver Work From Guilford Road to College Drive in College Park

BRICK PAVER INSTALLATION BEGINS EARLY JUNE

The Maryland State Highway Administration (SHA) will soon begin the brick paver installation phase of a \$2.5 million safety and resurfacing project on US 1 (Baltimore Avenue) between Guilford Road and College Drive in College Park. Work will begin in early June. Weather permitting, the brick paver installation should be complete by late August.

BUSINESSES BETWEEN GUILFORD ROAD AND COLLEGE DRIVE WILL BE IMPACTED

Crews will work Monday through Friday between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. The flow of vehicles accessing businesses on US 1 between Guilford Road and College Drive may be affected during the work. Vehicle access to businesses will be maintained throughout **all** phases of the brick paver installation.

As part of the brick paver work, SHA will remove and replace existing brick pavers on sidewalks, ramps and driveways near business entrances and exits.

Pedestrian access throughout the work zone will be maintained at **all** times. Temporary crossings including the use of barricades, arrow boards and signage that will direct pedestrians to the safest crossing routes.

Weather permitting, SHA will perform the brick paver work as expeditiously as possible to minimize impact to businesses.
